In Matthew 19 verse one and two we read, "Now when Jesus had finished these sayings, He went away from Galilee and entered the region of Judea beyond the Jordan; and large crowds followed Him, and He healed them there." Lukes Gospel records the same event this way in 9:31, "When the days drew near for Him to be received up, He set his face to go to Jerusalem." In these verses Jesus said goodbye to Galilee for the last time and He moves the heart of His ministry to Judea and Jerusalem where He knows the Cross of salvation is before Him, where He would demonstrate the Great Love of God. Jesus would say in John 15:13, "Greater love has no man than this, that a man lay down his life for his friends."

In the passion (the rejection, torture, misrepresentation, and crucifixion) of our Lord and King Jesus we see the Love of God on full display. During the week of His passion Jesus continued to teach in parables. During the season of Lent on Sunday Morning we at Walla Walla Presbyterian will be examining the parables of Passion Week as we remember the "No Greater Love of God." The Kingdom of God's love and salvation had come to the world and was about to be on its fullest display. The rightful King was going to lay down His life for the sake of His Kingdom and the people of that Kingdom.

Join us at10:01 each Sunday morning and at additional times through the weeks of Lent as Pastor Albert leads is as we ponder the great, great love of Jesus and examine these important teachings set against the backdrop of His passion. This series will help us contemplate the Passon of Jesus more deeply and will move us through Lent a time of reflection and examination to a survey of the Cross on Good Friday and then ultimately to the Resurrection we celebrate on Easter Morning when we see the Kingdom of God secured and its authority demonstrated.
